In planning the Inauguration we sought intentional representation of our alumni community, student community, along with leaders and representatives from across the Evangelical Covenant Church.

We enjoyed an inspiring week, which included a run to raise scholarship support for the North Park Fund, a community worship service, where Rev. Donna Harris preached the Word of support and challenge, and many leaders who joined in prayer and partnership for our university.

We hosted a provocative academic symposium on campus, studying the history, challenges and opportunities of the City, and we heard from our talented students who performed during a special concert on Thursday evening. We finished the week with an Investiture service that invited hundreds of representatives to our campus from the broad community of higher education from across the country.



It was an inspiring time to celebrate the legacy of our past, even as we turn our eyes to the future with the goal of strengthening our mission and our institution, as we face the very competitive marketplace of higher education.

The headwinds are before us. Challenging demographics — a steep decline in the number of students of college-going age — will mean that we must raise the level of excellence in all that we do. We must optimize our operation in a way that will give us the best opportunity for success.

There are some tailwinds with us, too. And that is good news ...

We have raised our academic profile, over the last two years ...

- We have raised more than \$1.3M for student scholarships this year alone
- We advanced the restoration project in our beloved Nyval Hall
- We conferred more than 700 degrees (in two commencement ceremonies across the year)
- And we have seen an increase in Covenant enrollment through assertive, dedicated recruitment efforts. This fall, we will nearly double the number of Covenant-affiliated students in the incoming class.

We celebrate these advances, even as we recognize that the marketplace of higher education is facing more intense competition than ever before.

At North Park University, we are prepared to elevate the visibility of our school and focus on the three core distinctives of our Christian identity, our strategic Chicago location, and the rich tapestry of the diverse student population that we serve.

This intensely competitive environment, will require us to be 100 percent focused on the recruitment and retention of our students ... the relevant and excellent educational opportunities we provide for them ... and the ways we must be devoted to supporting the needs of EVERY student who enters our gates ... and accepts our invitation to study, to live and learn on the campus at North Park.
