

MILTON B. ENGEBRETSON CHAIR IN EVANGELISM & JUSTICE

Reports to: Seminary Dean of Faculty

<u>Position Summary:</u> North Park Theological Seminary invites applications and nominations for the Milton B. Engebretson chair in evangelism and justice. This is a full-time, tenure track position in the ministry field. Rank dependent upon qualifications; salary commensurate with rank and experience.

Responsibilities:

- Teach in the areas of evangelism and disciple-making, especially as it links the gospel to justice, race, and culture in the seminary's Master of Divinity and Master of Arts programs.
- Direct Master of Arts in Restorative Justice Ministries offered through the <u>School of Restorative Arts</u>, including program development and oversight, faculty support, and representing the program to SRA donors, in collaboration with the SRA Director of Operations.
- Engage in research, writing, and speaking.
- Contribute to standard faculty responsibilities such as advising, assessment, and community life.
- Provide service to the North Park community and the Evangelical Covenant Church.

Qualifications:

- PhD, ThD, DMin, or related doctorate
- Ordination, preferably in the Evangelical Covenant Church
- Relevant experience in teaching and ministry
- Commitment to scholarly research and writing
- Interest, and preferably experience, in issues related to mass incarceration and prison education
- Proficiency in critical analyses of, and integration of hands-on ministry with, race and culture
- Desire to form students for a broad range of ministries
- Willingness to teach in person, online, and in prison.
- Demonstrated commitment to holistic ministries of evangelism and justice
- Compatibility with the ethos of the Evangelical Covenant Church and committed to North Park University's core values of Christian, city-centered, and intercultural

About North Park: North Park Theological Seminary (NPTS) is the denominational seminary of the Evangelical Covenant Church and is part of North Park University. Located for over 125 years on the tribal land of the Miami and Potawatomi tribes in what is today Chicago's northside, NPU is committed to serving diverse ethnic populations and has recently been designated an HSI. It is committed to excellence in both ministerial and academic formation and is accredited by the Association of Theological Schools and the Higher Learning Commission. It is a member of the Association of Chicago Theological Schools, a twelve-member consortium of schools from a variety of denominational backgrounds. North Park offers the following degrees: Master of Divinity, Master of Arts in Theological Studies, Master of Arts in Christian Ministry, Master of Arts in Christian Formation, Master of Arts in Restorative Justice Ministries (at Stateville Correctional Center), and Doctor of Ministry in Preaching.
