## **Position Summary:**

The School of Professional Studies (SPS) at North Park University seeks a full-time tenure track appointment in Clinical Mental Health Counseling (CMHC). The candidate, reporting to the Dean of SPS, will direct the graduate program in clinical mental health counseling and teach in the CMHC program.

### Primary Responsibilities:

- Administer the CMHC curriculum
- Teach in the CMHC program
- Hire, supervise, and evaluate adjuncts who teach in the CMHC program
- Orient full-time faculty and adjuncts to the CMHC mission, program objectives, and curriculum
- Participate in the admissions process by interviewing students who completed the application process
- Respond to inquiries pertaining to the CMHC program as a whole
- Serve as one of the advisors to CMHC cohorts

- Complete assessment documents and annual report
- Work with the Registrar's office if courses are transferred
- Conduct external advisory board meetings twice per academic year
- Conduct CMHC faculty meetings at least twice per year
- Lead bi-weekly CMHC faculty meetings
- Attend SPS Team Meetings
- Lead new cohort orientations
- Assist with recruitment efforts such as meeting with prospective students as needed or attending information sessions
- Provide input to the Dean regarding the CMHC budget
- Serve on NPU faculty committee as assigned by Dean

Since the CMHC program runs year-round, the Director position is a 10  $\frac{1}{2}$  month position; summer schedule arranged with the Dean.

## Required Qualifications:

- Doctoral degree in Counseling Education
- Must identify with the counseling profession through memberships in professional counseling organizations, sustained professional development related to counseling, and research and scholarly activity in counseling
- Must hold or be eligible for licensure as a Clinical Professional Counselor (LCPC) in the State of Illinois
- Minimum 3-year proven success teaching at the graduate college level
- Strong and collaborative proven leadership and administrative skills
- Knowledge and understanding of CACREP Standards
- Possess a clear understanding of and personal commitment to North Park University's mission of Christian higher education and intercultural values
