Spiritual Direction: "Listening to the Movement of God in the Church and the World" SPFM 7505-Three Credits Course #5 of the Certificate in Spiritual Direction

Course Description

The final course in the certificate in spiritual direction equips participants to embrace the call to the ministry of spiritual direction. A combination of self-evaluation and Center staff evaluation will be components in the final discernment process of engaging the church and the world as a trained spiritual director. Participants will also receive instruction and practice in Group Spiritual Direction. The course will begin with a silent retreat and end with a consecration service and the awarding of certificates.

Course Objectives

- 1. Gain basic competence in the field of group spiritual direction.
- 2. Receive further training in topics relevant to spiritual directors: setting up a ministry practice, prayer practices, dream work, and trauma informed spiritual direction.
- 3. Develop-a plan for one's continued formation as a spiritual director that includes a "Spiritual Director's Rule of Life" (See bottom of Document).
- 4. Deepen skills as a spiritual director with two additional triad practice sessions.

Course Requirements

- 1. Please be present and engaged in all sessions and course material beginning Monday, July 21, to Sunday, July 27. The detailed schedule is below.
- 2. Complete the required readings before arriving on campus. Fill out the completion form on Canvas by July 22. The books you will read are essential for your learning and will provide a solid foundation to guide you in the practice of direction. Be prepared for a discussion of all the books on Thursday, July 24, at 7 pm. The recommended list includes titles connected to the art and practice of direction, but you may choose to read them at a later time.
- 3. Please bring written notes on two dreams you've had, along with your reflections. These will be used in the Dream Workshop with Melanie Myatt. Melanie will invite individuals to share elements from their dreams, but only if they feel comfortable doing so.
- 4. Prepare a 2-page (double-spaced, approximately 500 words) testimony on the topic: "My Personal Journey as a Spiritual Director." You will read this paper to your cohort on Saturday morning. Consider this testimony as a final reflection and summary of your experiences and learning over the past two years. Speak from your heart and provide insight into how you have been touched by God and by each other. Identify your personal strengths and gifts as a spiritual director, and graciously acknowledge your areas for growth or weaknesses as well. As always, feel free to exercise your creativity as much or as little as you wish when shaping your presentation. A couple of samples are available on Canvas to assist with your writing. This assignment can be written during the week of the intensive, but I recommend having the basic structure and content completed before your arrival. You can modify your writing based on your experiences during the intensive.

Please upload your paper to Canvas before class time on Saturday.

5. For your personal reflection and cohort sharing on Saturday morning and afternoon, prepare **two** items (In addition to requirement #4):



- A. Spiritual Director Rule of Life (form at the end of syllabus). The intent of this exercise is to help you articulate how you will continue to grow as a spiritual director, how you will pay attention to your soul as a director, and how you will oversee your ministry. Consider a spiritual direction rule of life as a parallel to your personal rule of life. Both are important and create the conditions in which your life and ministry of direction can flourish. This exercise is also designed to help you embrace your call to direction by putting your thoughts on paper. By using this form, you are attempting to answer the question: As a spiritual director, what do you feel invited to do daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, and yearly to nurture health and steward your direction practice effectively? It would be beneficial for everyone to engage with this assignment over the coming months. Reflect on what your ministry of direction might look like. It is advisable to have this assignment mostly complete before your arrival, as you will be sharing your "Rule" with one another.
- B. Bring your supervisor's evaluation and your personal evaluation from 7504. You will use these two documents to help you reflect on what God has been doing in your life as a director in training. You don't need paper copies with you, but you'll need to be able to view them on your device and share highlights from them with each other on Saturday.

Grading

Grading is Pass/Fail. All components of the course must be completed satisfactorily in order to earn a "Pass" and receive your Certificate at the consecration service.
